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## *Executive summary*

The Data Management Plan (DMP) is the key document presenting the data management processes to be carried out in the WP4. Application Experiments Selection – the package dedicated to the full process of the 2 open calls foreseen, ensuring the selection of the 20 most relevant application experiments with respect to the expected impact. The partner responsible for the Plan, as well as for executing the proper data management in the project is Fundingbox (FBOX).

The Data will be generated through the accessible information (i.e. reports published on the logistics in manufacturing industry area), project partners and external evaluators activities, third party beneficiaries and uses cases, and the Open Platform for Innovation in Logistics (OPIL) PLATFORM. Is it planned that it will be collected through an online form within FBOX Platform which will be used during the project's Open Calls. The Plan presents overall strategy for creation and management of the Open Call Package Documents, including: Call announcement, Guide for Applicants (GfA), Guide for Evaluators (GfE), Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) and Application forms. The Open Call management tool and general set up of the personalized and customized FBOX platform for the L4MS Open Calls is described.

Datasets will be anonymized for impact assessment and research purposes. All the personal data will be treated in line with the REGULATION (EU) 2016/679 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL of 27 April 2016 and it will be accessible for authorized users only (validated via authentication processes).

In order to assure the full anonymity, all documents associated to a particular project submitted through the Open Calls, will be identified with a unique and persistent number (given at the time of the submission process) and specific keywords will be used to easily identify documents during the evaluation and analysis processes.

The full set of anonymous data will be available for the third parties that would request access to the information for research purposes. Other than that, the data will not be publicly accessible (no open access). Common comprehensive formats for data interoperability will be established (to be respected by all the Project partners). Regarding the ethical issues, they will be managed by the L4MS Ethical Committee, ensuring that all the H2020 standards and guidelines are applied correctly. In order to prevent overlapping between this Data Management Plan and the D7.5 L4MS Ethical Report, the later will become a superordinate document to D4.1.

The usage of data (including the access to the third parties) after the L4MS project is finished in March 2021 will be defined and agreed upon once the L4MS consortium progresses with the vision regarding the sustainability for the project. This aspect will be discussed in one of the upcoming updates to Data Management Plan V2.0.

The Data Management Plan presents the templates for 'Informed consent forms' and 'Information sheet'.
